


2017 Annual Dinner a Success!

2018 Annual Business Meeting Recap

While it was snowed out in January, weather was no problem for our rescheduled Annual Business Meeting. The chapter meet on Tuesday, February 20th, 2018 to go over the past year, hear about potential upcoming projects, and vote on board candidates and bylaws changes.

Chapter President Jeff Wright explained how 2017 was a major success for the chapter in 5 key areas; building more business partnerships, enhancing our financial standing, expanding Trout in the Classroom, engaging and building the membership, and making a conservation impact. These 5 areas will continue to be a target for improvement in 2018 and Mr. Wright challenged all chapters members to get involved in ensuring their success.

Chapter members unanimously voted to support three potential project for 2018/2019. These were the creation of the Doe River Fishing Trail, working with TWRA and TVA to build a mobility impaired fishing dock at the Blevins Rd Fishing Access, and working on a joint project with the Cherokee Chapter in Rocky Fork State Park.

Chapter Treasurer Sean Fagan explained our 2017 finances. The chapter finished the year with over \$12,000 in the bank but a majority of that is designated to specific projects and expenses. He estimated that we currently have a little under \$3,000 unallocated and are on track to finish the year with just under \$7,000 in the bank outside of any grants we may secure.

Finally, Laura Thompson and Daniel Back were both unanimously elected to the Board of Directors and the proposed 2018 Bylaws Amendments were also unanimously approved. If you would like to see what these changes entail, they are available on our website.


